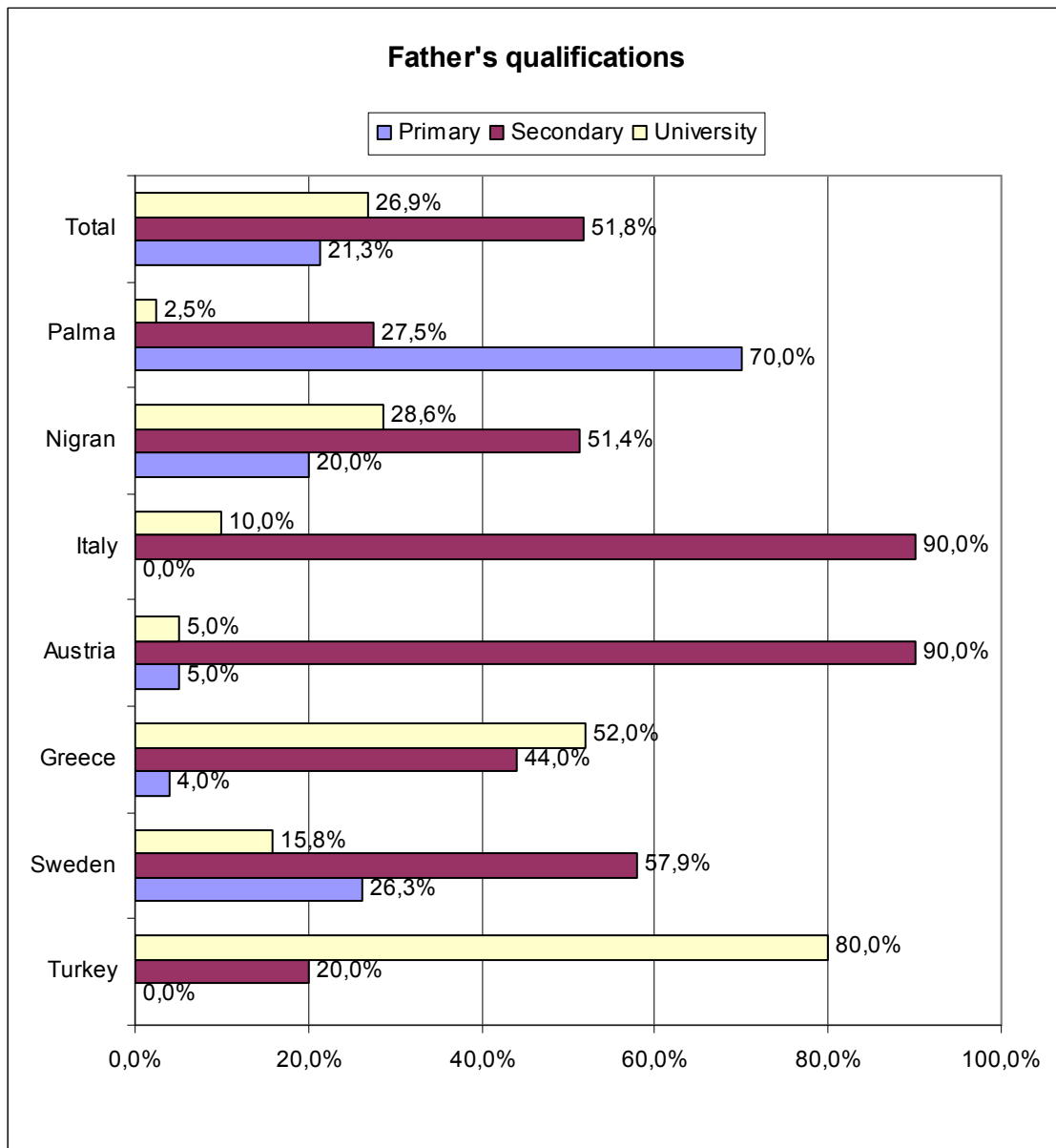


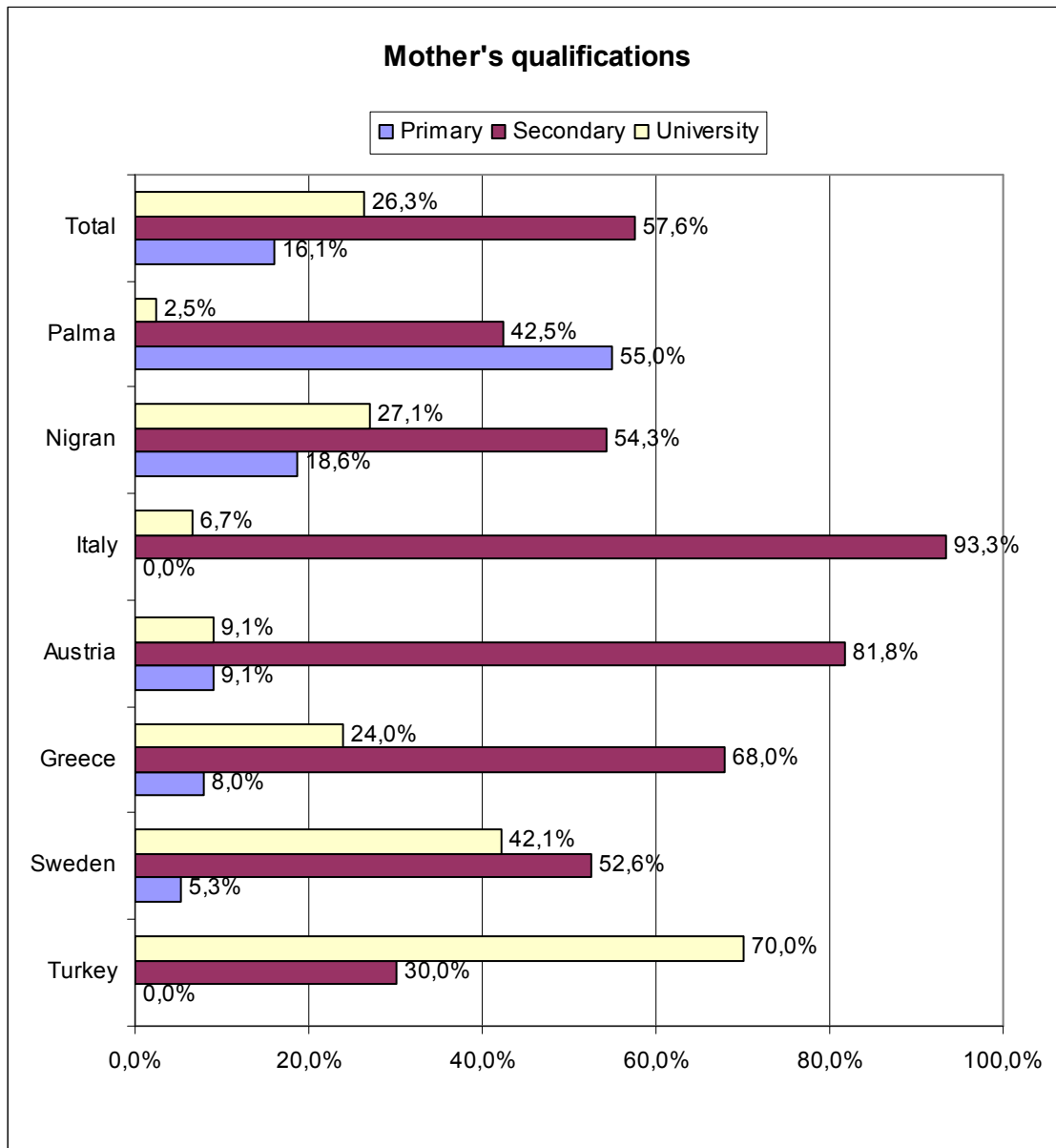


Results of a survey among our students

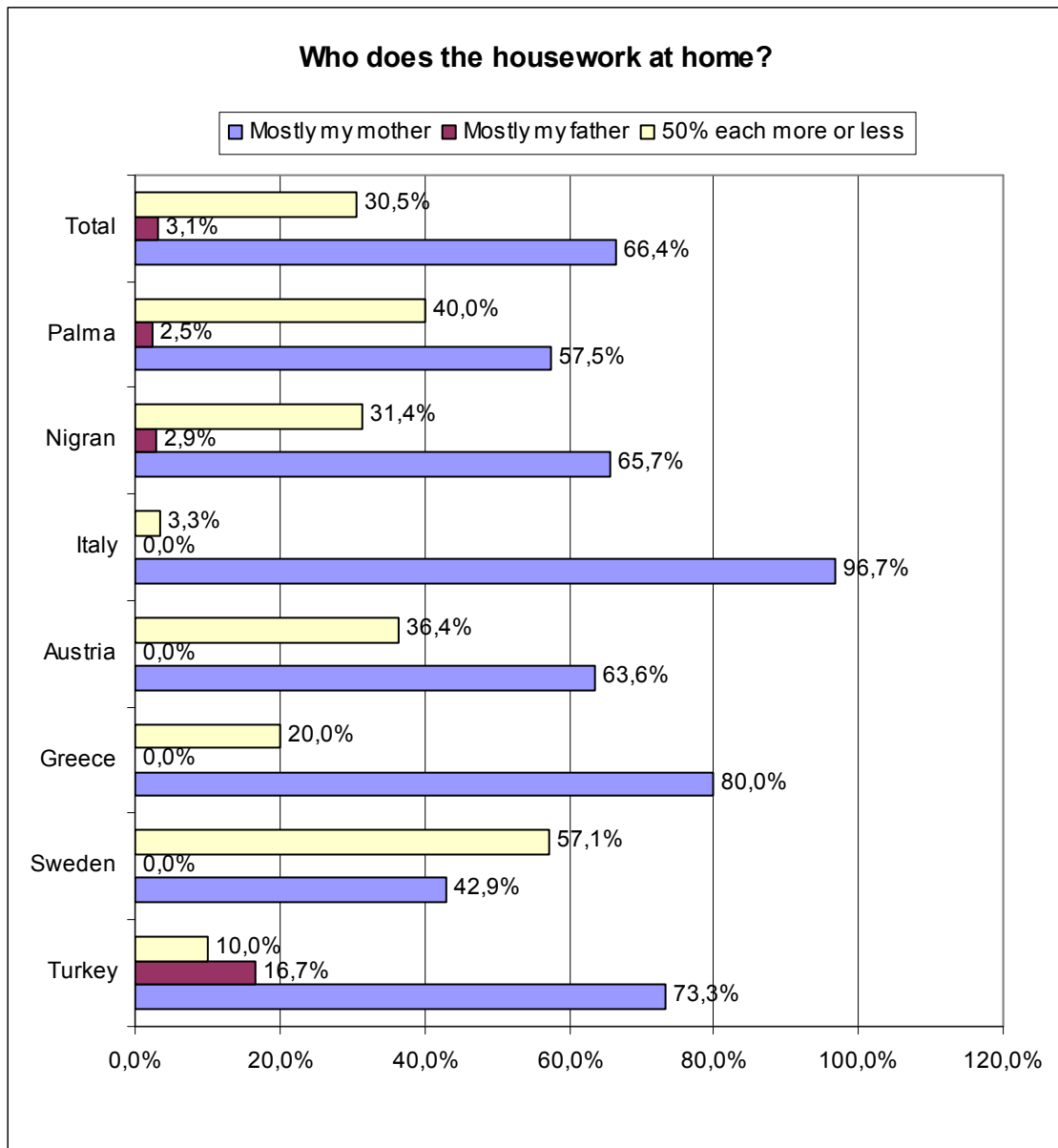
In order to show and understand the differences in some aspects of our students, a survey among them was filled in all the schools. We have chosen eleven questions, you can see here graphics with the results of the survey:

The first two questions were about parents' qualifications. The students had to choose if their parents had gone just to primary school, secondary school or they have an university degree. Here are the results:

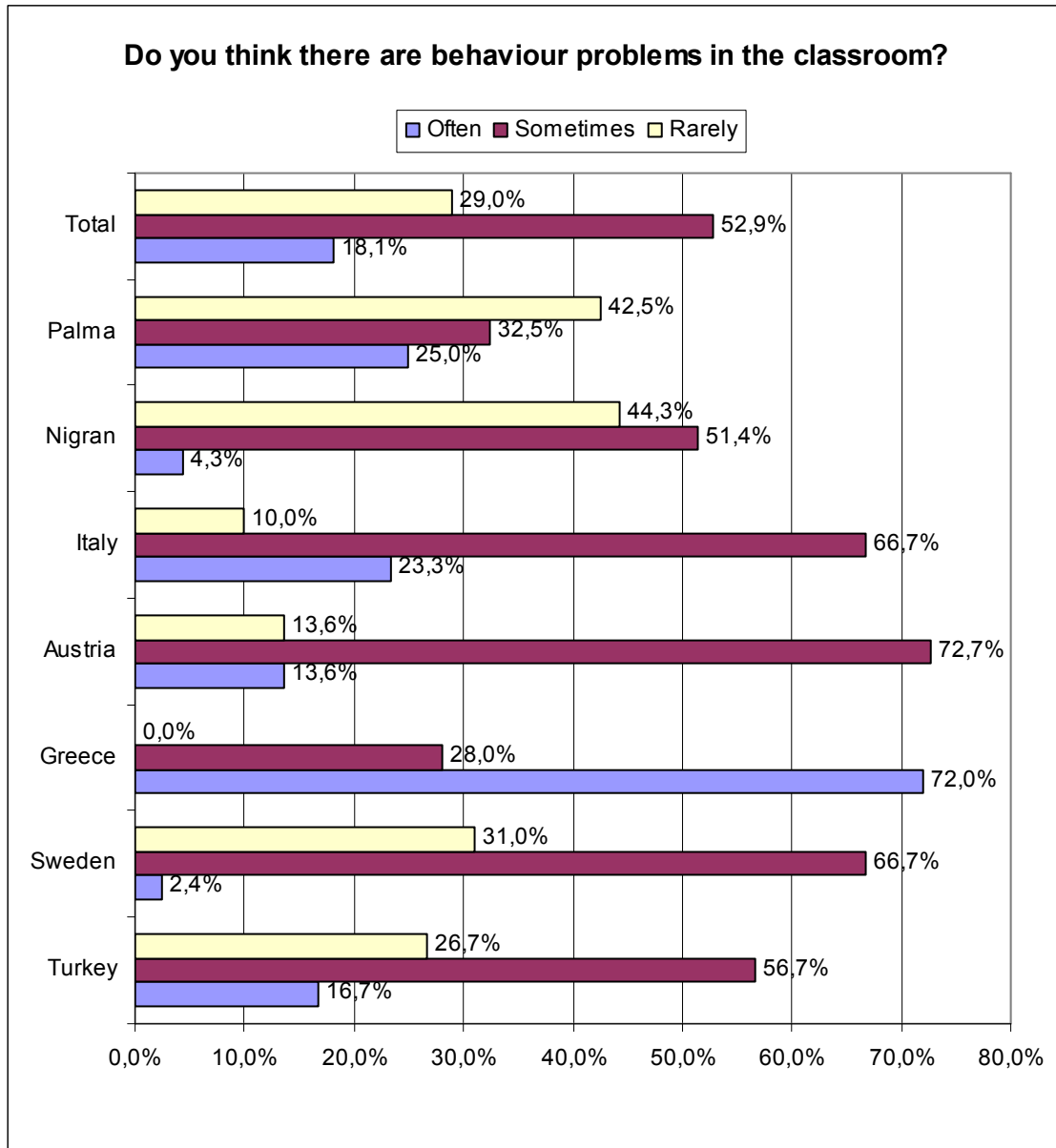




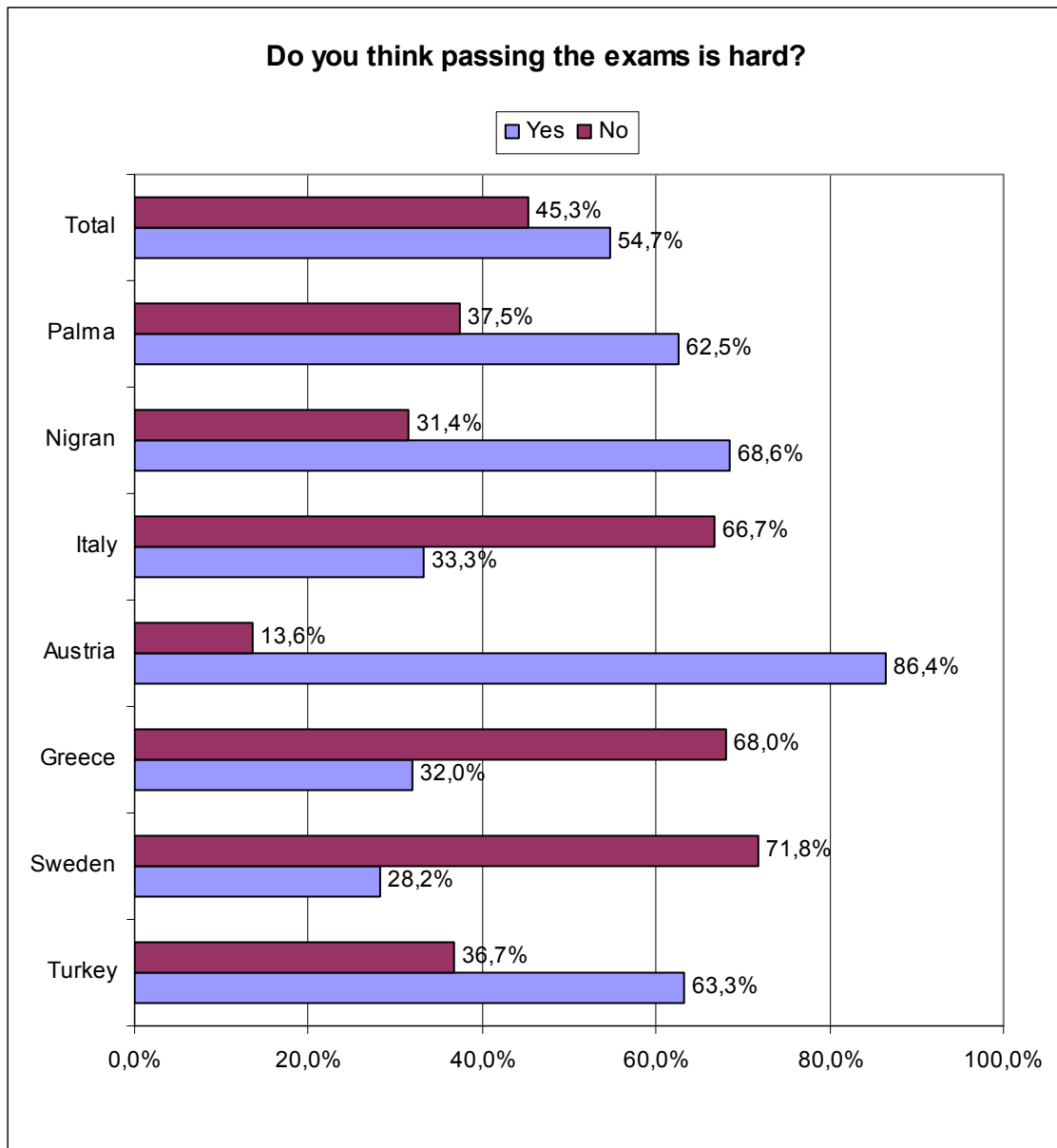
The following question was: Who does the housework at home? (cooking, take care of children...). You can see here the results:



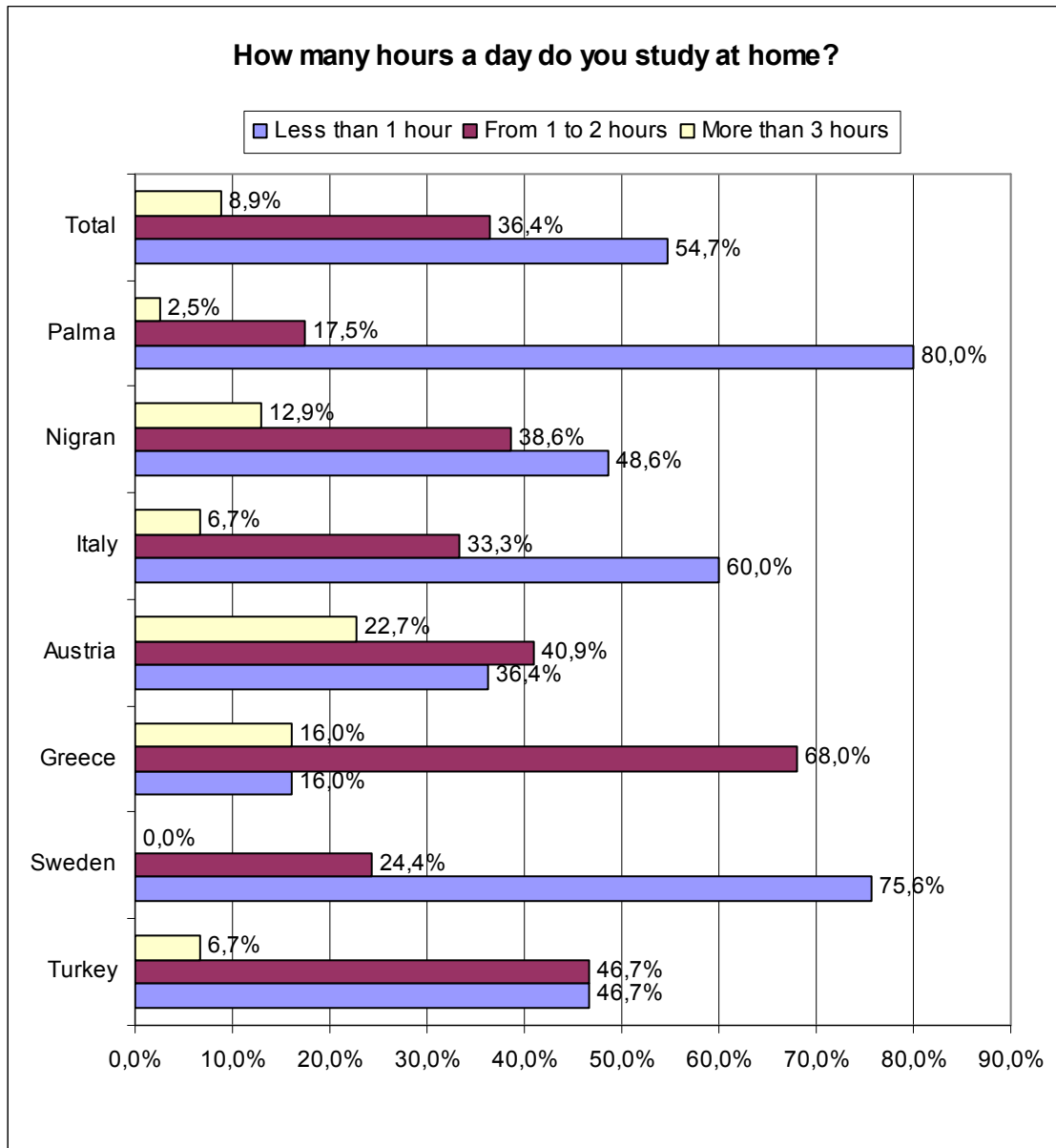
One important point was the behaviour at the classroom. Do our students think there are behaviour problems in the classroom? These was their point of view:



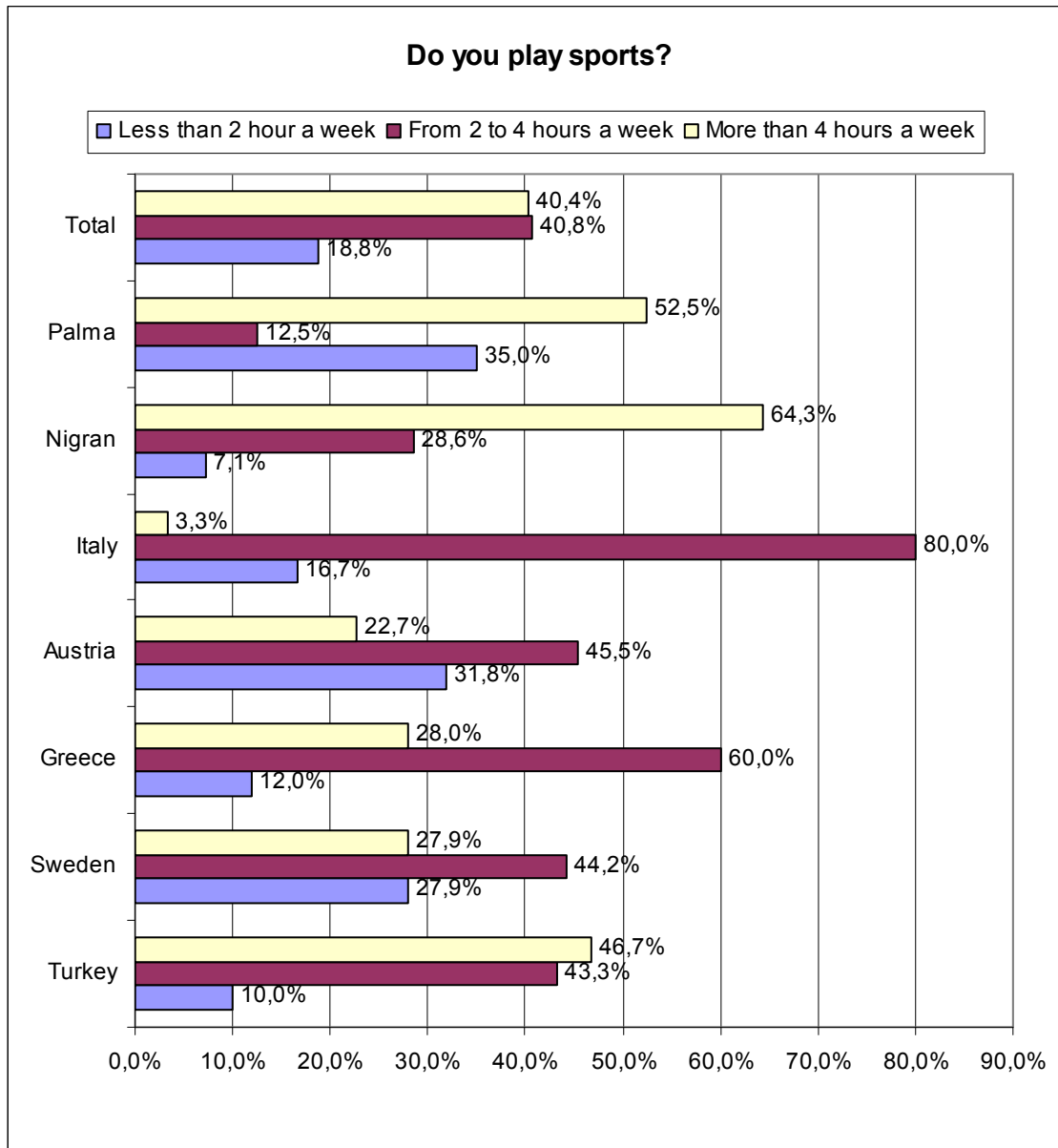
What do our students think about passing the exams? Do they think it is hard or not? There are differences among them. This is what they think:



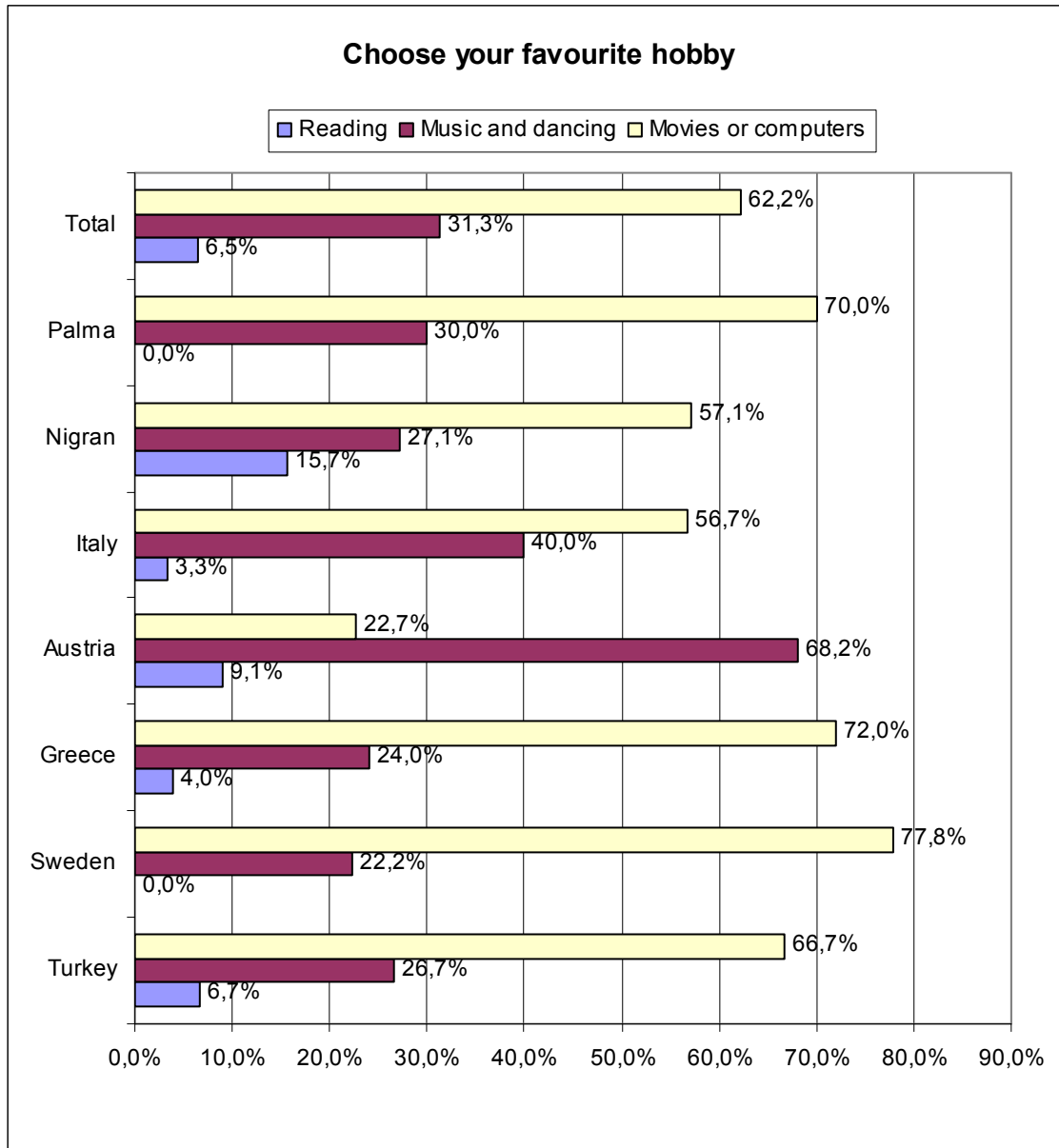
Passing or not the exams is also a question of how hard do they work. We have also found differences among them asking "how many hours a day do you study at home?" Here are the results:



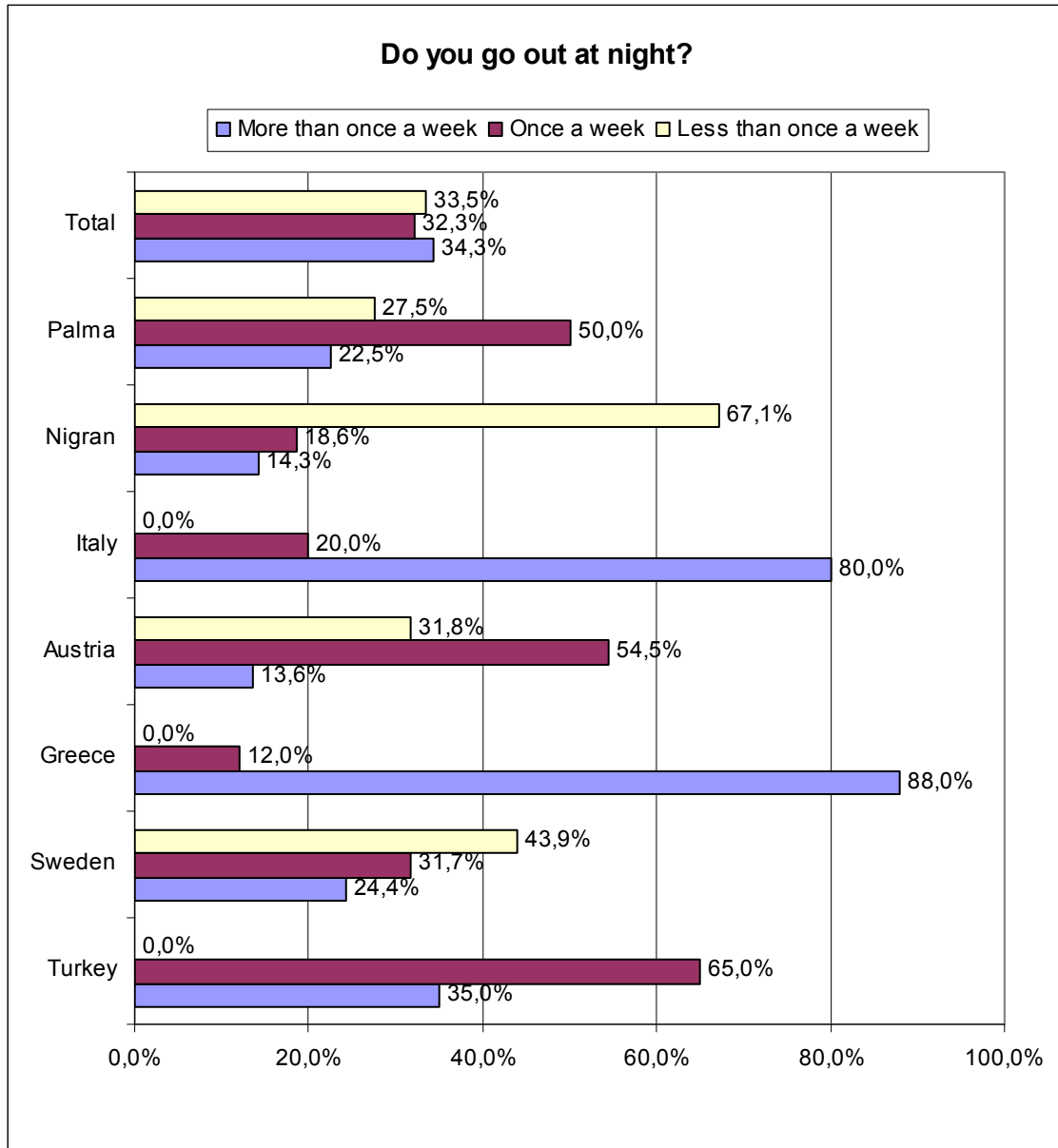

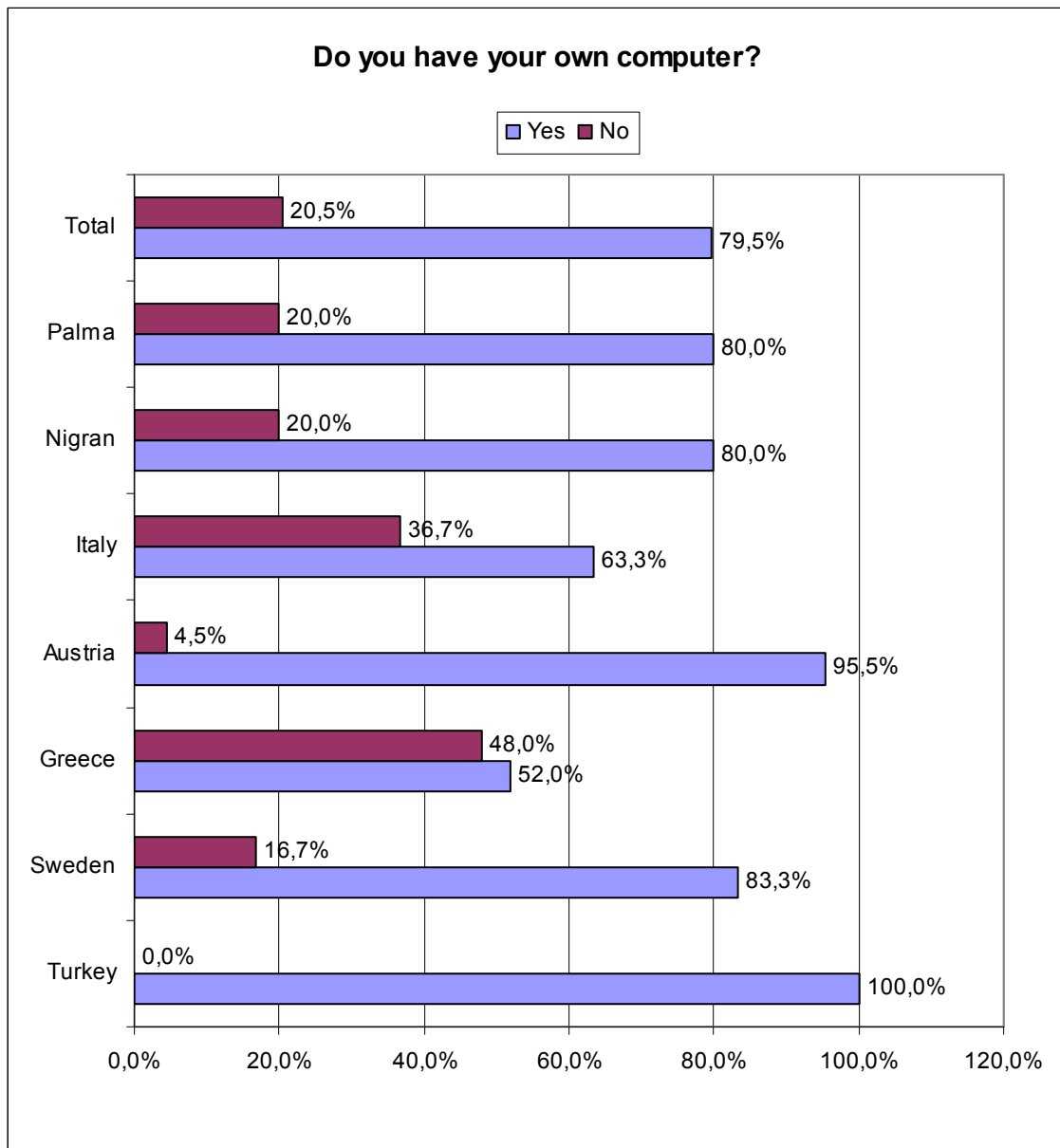
Appart from sports, our students have more hobbies. We have asked them to select among three them and these were their answers:



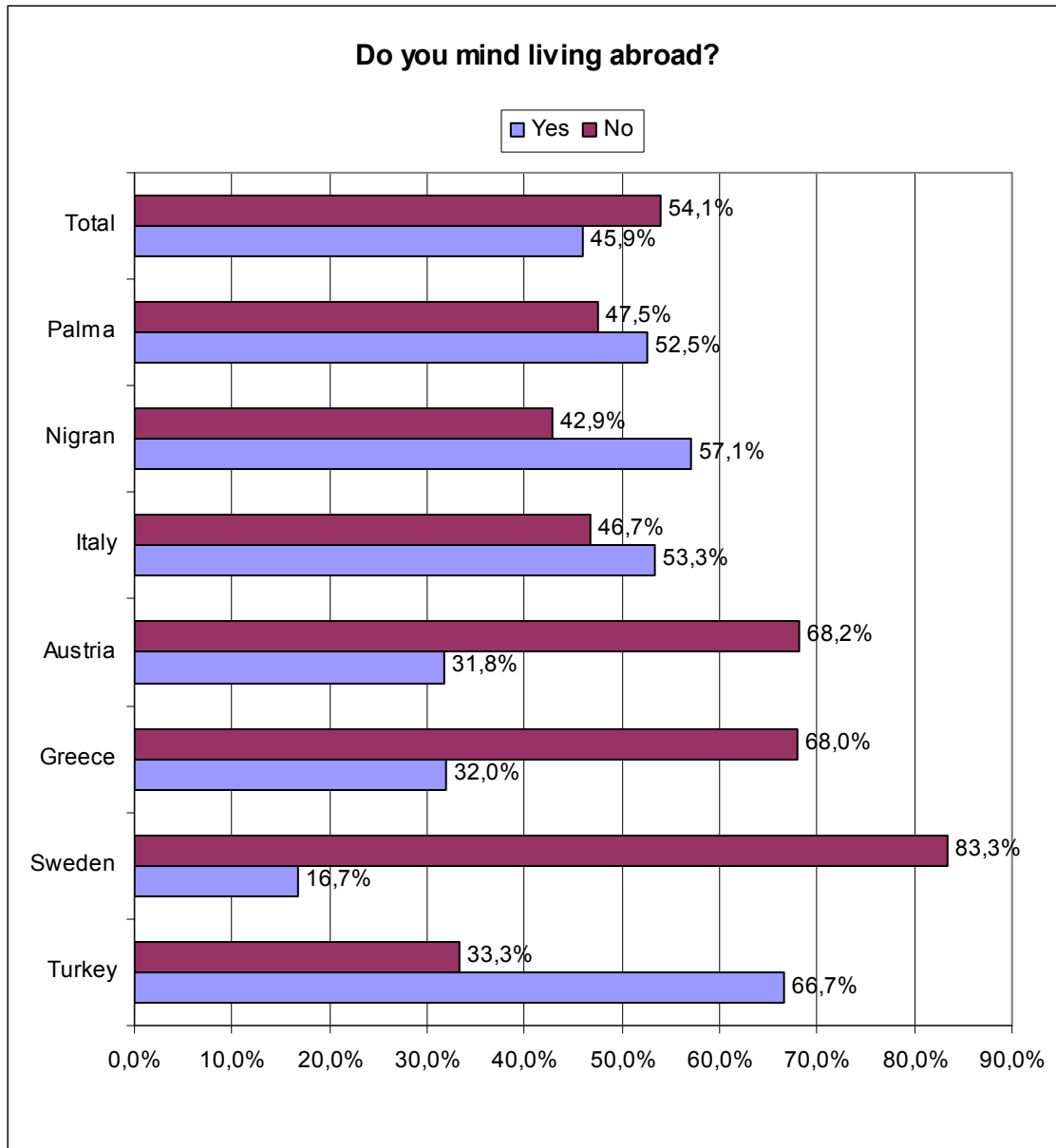
